Dear Parents.

It is my pleasure to introduce myself as the new Head of School at St Ambrose Barlow. I have enjoyed meeting the children each day at the gate and having the opportunity to speak to parents. I hope to get to know each of you as the year continues. The children have made an excellent start back at school and I am pleased the new routines which have been introduced seem to be successful.

Morning drop off will continue as it is: children will walk down to the gate and be welcomed by a member of senior staff before walking into school and into their classroom. Staff are on duty in the morning in the playground to ensure this is a calm and safe process.

Afternoon dismissal: the gates will open at 3:20, which should give parents time to come onto the school playground itself. Children will be dismissed at 3:30 directly to the adult. Children from Year Two and above will then make their way out of the playground via the exit at the other side of the playground. To ease congestion, parents of children in Reception or Year One can exit by the front gate by the school office.

#### **Covid measures**

The past two years have been a radically different experience for all schools, with isolations, bubbles, social distancing and remote learning. Hopefully, we are starting to see a return to a slightly more normal approach, although we still need to be vigilant about reducing the risk of infection and transmission.

To this end, please make a note of the following information:

- There is a risk assessment still in place but assemblies can resume and alternative arrangements to avoid mixing at lunch are no longer needed.
- If a child tests positive, then he/she will still need to isolate for the required amount of time.
- Pupils should not come into school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19 (for example, they are required to quarantine).
- However, the DfE guidance stipulates that children are no longer required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, as they are below the age of 18 years.
- If anyone in school develops COVID-19 symptoms, no matter how mild, they should be sent home and parents should follow public health advice.

If a school has a substantial increase in the number of positive cases, a director of public health might advise the school that face coverings should temporarily be worn in communal areas or classrooms (by staff and visitors, unless exempt). Our contingency plans cover this possibility.



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## **Swimming**

Swimming begins on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> September. This term, Year Three are attending. Each Wednesday, each child will require their swimming kit, a towel, a pair of goggles **and a swimming hat**. They will be transported to and from Tudor Grange pool by coach. No earrings are allowed in the swimming pool so no children in Year Three should wear earrings on Wednesdays.

#### **PE dates**

Children will need their PE kit in school each day. On the days(s) your child has PE, they will get changed from their uniform into the kit. Kits will be sent home periodically to be washed and then we ask that they are returned promptly. Miss Ball is our PE co-ordinator and liaises with other agencies who deliver parts of our curriculum and our clubs, including Hall Green tennis and Aston Villa football coaching.
