Collective worship happens in class each day. Every week ends with a celebration of our achievements and these two assemblies book-end our week in school and adds to a real feeling of community. This is also where we celebrate and praise those individuals who appear in our Golden Book for going above and beyond in their Christian calling and embodying by their actions what it means to be a pupil at Saint Ambrose Barlow.

Traffic outside of school

Birmingham City Council have been contacted about both the flow and speed of traffic outside school, in an effort to make our school environment both safer and more pleasant. Nobody can promise a quick resolution but please rest assured it remains a priority!

The school requires like a crossing supervisor employed to replace Tony, who a lot of you were very fond of. This is an appointment made by the council and not by school but there has been some progress.



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Speed bumps will also slow traffic down, making our immediate vicinity outside school safer and I also believe that this was agreed some time ago and now needs to be initiated.

Uniform

Since the children returned, staff have had a real focus on uniform. We are encouraging all children to take pride in the appearance – after all, they are wearing the uniform of St Ambrose Barlow School and should see this as a privilege that comes with certain obligations. A reminder, therefore, that the following rules apply.

All children should wear black school shoes.

There have been examples of some schools allowing their children to wear black trainers that pass as shoes but this should not creep in at St Ambrose Barlow. Therefore, please purchase sensible school shoes for your child to wear.

No child should be wearing jewellery so necklaces and bracelets should not be worn. Historically, children in Key Stage Two have been allowed to wear earrings. However, I am currently in consolations with the governors because, with the increased provision of after school clubs, we should be following the advice shared by the Association for Physical Education that NO earrings whatever should be worn on the days that children have physical activity, which is likely to be most days. This is especially pertinent now we have introduced the Daily Mile, where children aim to run a mile each day in school time.

I will communicate the decision of the Governors after our Full Governing Body

meeting but I am keeping you abreast of what is under consideration.

Congratulations to all those who were attending the All Britain Gaelic Football Championships last Friday. Below is an account from Maeve Cunningham in Year 5:


"I am here to tell you some facts and information about my Gaelic football life. I hope you enjoy.
