Admission Policy Consultation

We are about to start a full consultation for the school's proposed admissions arrangements for 2023/24. This is a formal process that must be undertaken if a) there are any changes to the proposed policy, or b) every seven years, even if there are no changes. This latter element applies to St Ambrose Barlow. The consultation will run from 1st December for six weeks, and its

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purpose is to allow anyone with an interest in the school's arrangements to comment or object to the planned policy before it is finalised.

To this end, the new policy will be emailed out to all parents of current pupils as well as being sent to local nurseries so any parents of children in the immediate area can comment. A copy of the policy will also be sent to the local authority (Birmingham), any neighbouring local authorities (Solihull) as well as the Diocese.

Should you have any comments, please follow the process and contact the school. The consultation will run for six weeks: it will begin on 1st December and end on 12th January 2022. All of this information is on our website and will be pinned to our Twitter feed.

Attendance at mass

The Year Three children who are preparing for their First Holy Communion and First Confession did themselves and the school proud on Sunday, as did the readers from Year Four. It would be a wonderful Advent resolution for as many children as possible to aim to attend mass at St Ambrose Barlow every week during Advent, especially if you don't normally attend. I know there is a temptation for our every day activities to intrude upon our time at the weekend but I do think it is important to make time for our spiritual nourishment too.

Christmas cards

There is a growing trend for children (and adults) not to send Christmas cards and to make a donation to charity instead, which is in line with the Church's teaching about sustainability and stewardship. However, should you wish to send Christmas cards, may I suggest either of the following:

- a) Children send ONE Christmas card to the teacher and the rest of the children, which can then be displayed in class
- b) If children are sending individual Christmas cards, that they write the name of that child and the class on the envelope and that these are posted in our special Christmas postbox in the hall. The prefects, though they don't know this yet, will then sort and deliver these cards each afternoon.

Of course, you may wish not to send any cards at all and that is perfectly fine.

COVID

Children who are absent from school following a positive test will have work set for them to complete when they are able. Siblings have to attend as normal, following government guidelines.

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Our hand washing, ventilation and sanitising system remains but class bubbles will not return unless advised by Public Health England following five positives cases in the same vicinity with a limited time frame. Thankfully, this has not happened and hopefully will not.
