Golden Book

Dear Parents,

I will start this newsletter in exactly the same manner that I ended last week's - by encouraging the children to attend Sunday Mass. Someone must have alerted Father Paul because he tried his hardest to clear me out of house points by Monday morning! Since it was Trinity Sunday, I had to give three house points out to all who attended - one for the Father, one for the Son, and one for the Holy Spirit.

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the feast of Corpus Christi, Latin for 'the Body of Christ'. The children will recognise the Gospel as the Feeding of the 5,000 and it is one of my favourites. As I will tell the children on Monday, we can understand the Gospel as a literal miracle where Jesus defies the laws of physics and turns five loaves and two fish into a quantity so great that nobody goes hungry. We can also understand it in a metaphorical manner, with the explanation being that everyone searches around for a scrap of food that they've bought and they find they have enough to share: so much to share, and so many people present, that nobody ends up gong hungry. It is surely the same for the world today: there is not a shortage of food, there is a shortage of sharing.

We have celebrated Reception class Mass today – the final class Mass of the year. I love them, and I hope you do too. It is really important for parents and extended family to join in with our Catholic Life in school, and I am looking forward to next year's class Masses already.

Reception: Ella Kirby for always making a great effort to achieve her best in every lesson. Ella has grown in confidence in both her reading practice sessions and phonics and trying really hard when writing phase 4 words. She is always kind, thoughtful and supportive of her peers. Keep up the hard work, Ella!

Year One: Ethan Burke is in the golden book this week for consistently producing work of a high standard. This week he wrote a fantastic story about robots using his imagination. He is a fantastic role model to everyone and he should be very proud of himself.

Year Two: Poppy Nixon for some excellent maths work during Year Two's 2D and 3D shape topics. As well always putting 100% effort and concentration into her work, Poppy is always so helpful around the classroom. Thank you for consistently making the right choices and leading by example!

Year Three: Halle Parsons for her hard work and determination across all lessons this week, which has led to some excellent work being produced. Well done, Halle keep up the good work!

Year Four: Danielle Velasquez for writing and performing a fabulous narrative poem, showing off the values and virtues of eloquent and attentive. Danielle has also made superb progress during recent swimming lessons, demonstrating а variety of strokes. Keep up the excellent work, Danielle!

Year Five: Sami Thafiq has worked hard to produce an amazing piece of extended scifi writing in Literacy. He showed off a range of ambitious vocabulary and complex sentence types. As well as this, Sami

displayed excellent sportsmanship in PE this week, supporting his teammates and encouraging them during team games.

Year Six: Nigel Tong for settling into Year Six really well and working very hard since he started with us. He has produced some super writing this week, using excellent vocabulary and a range of new sentence types.

Academic Dates for next year

These are on the website but I have reproduced them below. If there are any changes, you will be notified as early as possible.

As you are aware, children attend school for 190 days per year, while staff attend for 195. This means that there are five additional INSET days where school is closed to children, but this does not come out of a child's statutory entitlement to education. For the academic year, the following INSET days have been arranged:

Four of these days are where the staff focus on curriculum development, safeguarding training or new innovations for the benefit of the children.

*One of these INSET days is devoted to the staff's spiritual development. For the academic year 2022/23, this has been arranged for Friday 21st October, where staff will attend Mass at St Chad's, volunteer at St Chad's Sanctuary and also deliver food to the homeless in our local area. I am a big believer in staff setting an example for the children to follow and helping the homeless in the local area is an example of the staff at St Ambrose Barlow putting their faith into action. Autumn term will start on Wednesday 7th Sept and run until Friday 16th December.

Spring term will run from **Wednesday 4th January until Thursday 6th April**. Again, the governors have agreed to change the term dates from those released from the local authority so that children remain in school for Holy Week. I know this may cause some slight inconvenience for those of you with children (or indeed jobs) at other Catholic schools, but I am of the opinion that the quality of work produced by the children and the depth of spiritual reflection experienced by the children during Holy Week makes this a worthwhile decision.

Summer term will run from **Tuesday 24th** April until Tuesday 25th July.

Reading at St Ambrose Barlow

I would like to thank both parents and children for their continued support with the Book Fair. By buying books, you are encouraging and supporting your child to develop a love for reading. The money raised is used to buy books for the children's classroom libraries, supplemented by school budget.

Last week, a competition was run for KS2 to design a book cover and for KS1 to design bunting, promoting the book fair. All of the designs were fantastic so choosing the winners proved extremely difficult. The winners for their book cover designs were Seamus Griffin, Year Four, Logan Wilkins, Year Four, and Mikey Timms, Year Four. Bunting design winners were Ailbhe Lillington and Florence Young, both from Year One. They all won a book of their choice.

Mrs Hunt accompanied me on Tuesday to buy new books for next year. We have now supplemented each class library with new and modern high-quality books both

for reading for pleasure and for when teaching each Literacy genre. We are also reviewing our Guided Reading practice in KS2, looking at whole class reading and buying books so every child can access the same text at the same time, rather than small group provision (which will continue for those who require additional support and/or further challenge).
