School Uniform

It appears our hitherto high standards of uniform are starting to slip amongst a small but significant minority. The rules are on our website

(<u>https://www.sab.bham.sch.uk/uniform/</u>) but have been reproduced below:

Boys (Summer)

Grey school trousers (short or long) Pale blue polo shirt (with school logo) or short-sleeved school shirt and school tie Grey 'v' neck school pullover Plain grey or black socks Shoes

Girls (Summer)

School uniform checked to striped dress or grey school skirt/trousers Pale blue polo shirt (with school logo) or short-sleeved open neck school blouse (with school logo) Grey 'v' neck school cardigan/pullover Plain grey or white socks Plain grey or black tights Shoes or sandals

There should be 'no extremes of hairstyles' – they are not permitted. No child is to have less than a 'No. 2' cut; no child is to have lines or patterns shaved into his or her hair; there should be no extreme spiking or gelling and no artificial colouring. All long hair should be tied back and secured with hair attachment appropriate to school colours.

These are not new school rules – they were in existence before I started and they will be in existence long after I am gone. They are agreed by the Governing Body, and it is the Governing Body that has the power to change them. As it is, they are clearly communicated on the website and they will be enforced by the staff of the school.

To be perfectly honest, I do not want to police haircuts. I do not want to remind

children that trainers are not part of school uniform. I do not especially garner any pleasure from reminding children to tuck their shirt in, or do up their top buttons, or to ask girls not to wear nail varnish. That said, we have high standards and I expect all of our children to meet them. So if I have to speak to children who fall below the standard, then I will.

I will not apologise for having standards. We take pride in our uniform just as we take pride in our school. If you insist on getting your child's ears pierced, please wait until the summer holidays so that they can be removed safely before school if necessary. In any case, it is only studs that should be worn, not decorative earrings, not diamonds, and not earrings that dangle.

I have taken into account parental feedback with regards to the planned uniform changes, which will be postponed in light of the current cost of living. The uniform will not change overnight and parents will be fully consulted in future. Any changes will be phased in slowly and I will continue to accept and celebrate those children who wear the current uniform with pride. Finally, if you really do desire to go against our school rules, they please do not complain when there are consequences.

It will take place from 10am until around 2pm and children are to be transported by coach.
