Kids Zone @ SAB Breakfast & After School Clubs

This is now up and running and feedback given so far is that it is both welcome and a success. If you are interested in your child attending before school from 7:30 or after school from 3:30 until either 4:30 or 5:30, please pick up a form in the office. The morning sessions are paid in cash – it is £1 each morning for each child, and includes toast. The afternoon sessions are £5 per hour, which covers the cost of staffing and the use of space and equipment.

Uniform

The children looked very smart on their return school in their uniform and their smart shoes. All children should now be wearing their Autumn/Winter uniform: that is, shirt and tie (either the previous tie or the slightly new design). On this note, the new tie design comes in two formats: a clip-on one for ease for KS1, and an adult-style tie for KS2. Children can, of course, still wear their old-style tie. New ties have being ordered from our supplier and, once they have arrived, anyone who is unhappy with the quality of the tie they purchased previously can exchange it for free of charge in the school office.

A message from Father Paul...

I was delighted to see children at Mass last Friday, even though the circumstances surrounding the Queen's death on Thursday meant the atmosphere was more muted than normal.

I remarked to Mr Clinton how smart the new design of the jumper looked. Saying so is not intended to detract from any other child in a grey jumper, of course; all children looked smart but I was especially struck by how it made a real difference to appearance! I have since spoken to Mr Clinton and the parish would like to gift EVERY pupil in the school a new jumper. This is intended to help with the cost of living crisis that we are all experiencing, as well as making sure our children are warm and comfortable in the coming winter months.

The idea behind the purchase would be that children could still wear their ordinary grey jumpers or cardigans day to day, but there will be special days of celebration – whole school Masses, perhaps, or school photographs - where every child can wear the new St Ambrose Barlow jumper.

I honestly think it will give children pride in their appearance and a real 'sense of occasion' to these special days. I know that school funds are stretched but I feel that the parish is in a fortunate position to be able to make this one-off outlay to celebrate our special school. Father Paul

Sacramental Preparation

A happy consequence of the closer ties between the school and parish is that now Sacramental preparation is to be shared - with some workshops taking place at the Church hall and led by school staff, and children will attend and enjoy workshops on Saturday morning led by parish catechists.

The first of these workshops will take place on Thursday 22nd September at 6pm. This is for parents of children making their first Holy Communion and will look at the function of Catholic schools, the special position that parents hold, and how teachers can best support parents in their role as first-educators.

Please make every effort to come along and share your ideas and feedback. It is intended to be a laidback and open dialogue! The children will then have their first session on Saturday 24th September at 10am until midday.
