Dear Parents,

You will have received some communication on Wednesday regarding a slight change to our curriculum approach that you may see more of in the coming months. Please allow me to outline below what these changes are.

At St Ambrose Barlow Catholic Primary School, we go over and above the requirements of the National Curriculum and - as voluntary aided Catholic school we have both a right and a duty to do so. When teaching, we are doing so through the lens of our Catholic faith, promoting Catholic Social teaching in order to build God's kingdom here on Earth. This has always been the case in many Catholic schools but, at St Ambrose Barlow, we are now doing so explicitly. Children can learn lessons from History about mistakes to avoid in the future, from Geography about the impact humans are having on the world, from even the literature they study in Literacy. In short, we are teaching children to ask questions about why the world is the way it is and what we as Christians can do to address and change it. Our Catholic Life and Mission underpins everything we do: assemblies, prayer, interactions with staff and pupils alike, policies and curriculum.

We also have a number of groups that function in school – such as the Spiritual Council and the Mini-Vinnies - that aim to bring about action through faith. I could not be more proud of the children involved in these ventures. The staff and children and governors are also working towards both the CAFOD 'Live Simply' award where we try to show a global impact, a local impact and a school impact by trying to live sustainably and show solidarity with our brothers and sisters across the globe. Finally, we are also aiming to become a 'School of Sanctuary', showing solidarity with refugees who have fled their homes to seek safe haven elsewhere. We had an assembly on Monday, leading on from last Sunday's Gospel about the rich man who did nothing to help Lazarus, and we examined the words of St James' letter, where he says faith without action is worthless. It is through our faith that we are required to act and that is what will bring about a positive change in our world.

Spiritual Council and Collective Worship

Eventually, children will lead these themselves, choosing readings, themes, music and little 'Going Forth' activities to help children in spreading the Good News.

From Monday, prayer bags will be sent home daily for children to write a reflection to Our Lady in October, a prayer for the faithful departed in November, and an Advent message in December. Please support your child in doing this.
