Dear Parents,

Welcome back after a well-deserved break over half-term. As you are aware, November is the month where we remember our dearly departed, praying for them and celebrating their memories. This will happen in class liturgies and will be a focus of each altar in the classroom. Please join us in this special celebration of your loved ones: each class is sending the prayer bag home for children to write their own prayers or draw a picture with the following message.

Throughout the month of November, children will be bringing the prayer bag home for one evening. It is important the bag is returned to school the next day for children to lead their class in Collective Worship and in order for everyone to get a chance to have a go at taking the prayer bag home.

In your bag you will find a holding cross, an exercise book and a laminated prayer card. Please follow the prayer card and once completed write your own prayer in this exercise book. Your prayer may be about a certain person who has died or about a particular saint. Children will then share this prayer tomorrow with their class.

Please colour a section of the picture below and add a drawing of anyone who has died that you would like us to pray for during the month of November. If you have any photographs or memory cards of people who have passed away that you would like to remember, please bring them into school and we will place them on our class altars. They will be kept safe and returned to you at the end of the month.

Finally, please join us for our Year Three Sacramental Preparation Mass this Sunday. The Year Three children who are preparing for their First Confession and their Communion will be leading us and Mrs Vinti will be leading us in our music. I can remember Fr Paul once generously gifting house points to each child who attended Mass one weekend. He has my permission to do this again, no matter which class the child is in! I will leave the amount he thinks appropriate totally to him. I fully expect to be almost bankrupt after Monday's assembly.
