We have tried as long as possible to maintain the low cost of meals but, at some point this academic year, we may have to put up the price. This will be a decision taken by the Governors, following advice from the local authority. I will endeavour to give you as much notice as possible and keep any price rise to an absolute minimum.

On a related note, anyone who wishes to buy either a sausage or bacon sandwich on Tuesdays will now have to pay in advance on Monday, so we can reduce our waste and cater for exact numbers only. The price of this sandwich is rising to £1 from January 2023. Toast will remain at 30p and can be purchased on the day.

"The SVP is looking to recruit a Centre Manager for its new SVP Support Centre which will begin operating out of Manningford Hall in Druids Heath within the next month or two.
