Strike action

On Wednesday, I sent out communication regarding the school's decision to close for all children and open only for the children of frontline critical key workers.

The staff who are members of the NEU are entitled to take action and it is not against the school or our families that they are acting, but the government and the Department of Education. I know it is inconvenient to close the school due to the industrial action taking place but I also know you will agree with me that our staff always go above and beyond in their offer for the children and, while nobody wishes to take such action, they are making a case that schools must be funded properly if schools are to do their job effectively.

Free School meals application

Please check to see if you are eligible for free school meals, even if you are currently in receipt of Universal Free School Meals (i.e. have children in Reception, Year One and Year Two). If you are or have been eligible, even for one day, the school will receive £1,450 every year which a makes a huge difference to our budget and how we can better provide for our children. More funding can be used to subsidise school
