Dear Parents,

Our newsletter is a day early due to breaking up today on Maundy Thursday, the start of the Easter Triduum - the three sacred days that trace the final days of Jesus' life, His death, and His resurrection. Holy Week is the holiest of all weeks in the Church's liturgical calendar and it is also a very special time to be in school. The prayerfulness, the assemblies, the religious reflections and the sense of anticipation for Easter all add to the beautiful atmosphere. I know, in a pragmatic sense, that this might be an inconvenience for those with siblings (or indeed jobs) at other schools but, in a perfect world, all Catholic schools would be in for this week and I hope one day that this is the case. It is our faith that marks us out as different.

I am writing this just after watching Year Six's very moving Stations of the Cross. It was absolutely incredible.
