Dear Parents,

Yesterday evening, we gathered in our prayer garden for a beautiful outdoor Mass (outdoor Masses in my opinion always seem extra special, perhaps because they are such infrequent occurrences) that celebrated not the children of Year Six but, instead, the families where this year marks the last year of their involvement with the school. As Miss Ball said in last night's introduction, this might be mere months or it might be the end of many years and many children — I think I heard seventeen years mentioned last night!

This Mass also marked the start of another poignant tradition that will happen annually - along with our Marian and Corpus Christi processions — and will join our Holy Week assemblies and class Masses as joyful occasions where the family and school come together to celebrate and mark their faith.

Talking of faith, the children have had a wonderful week celebrating other faiths in our local community: Reception learnt moreabout their own Catholic faith in the church they are familiar with. Hindu Temple, Year Four visiting the Jewish synagogue, Year Five going to the Sikh Gurdwara and Year Six at Birmingham, Central Mosque. This will be another permanent feature in our calendar.

Finally, Year Three celebrate the end of their Communion programme this Sunday with their Going Forth Mass and Communion breakfast. Please come along and join the school and the parish in this special celebration.

# THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 25th June 2023



Jesus instructed the twelve as follows: "Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in

whispers, proclaim from the house-tops. Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; think more about God who has power over both body and soul. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows. So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven.

Fittingly for our Going Forth Mass, this week's Gospel revolves around a public declaration of faith, safe in the knowledge that God loves us and cares for us. We know that as our children grow up they face many temptations - not least the temptation to hide their faith away as if it is something to be ashamed of – and I have always taught that proudly displaying who we are and what we believe is the best way to combat this. We make no apology for being a Catholic school and we should make no apology for proudly following in the footsteps of Christ: standing up for the deprived, alienated and excluded and showing love and compassion for, and solidarity with, our brothers and sisters around the world.

This was a great success and a celebration of the other cultures, creeds and religions that exist around the world and are also vibrant in our own local community!
