#### Maths INSPIRE workshops

Last year, you were all invited in to take part in an "Alan Peat" Literacy writing lesson that focused on sentence types. This year, the focus will be on Maths No Problem, which is a resource that we use in school. Every class will have a session in Spring Term. Consider this advanced notice but, please, don't panic – the children will do *all* the work!

#### NumBots and Times Table Rocks Stars

We are having a real push on this in school. My personal view of homework is that it should only focus on what the children already know in an effort to encourage automaticity – basically, the retrieval and quick recall of facts (whether these be times tables number bonds or spelling rules). Children should be logging in most nights but only for a short amount of time – around five to ten minutes or so – which adds up over the week. Each class has a weekly average that children should be aiming for, which ranges from fifteen minutes for Year One on NumBots, to thirty-five minutes for Year Six on TTRS.
