

### **School Building Fund**

You will have no doubt seen the drive for school improvement here these past few years: in 2021, we have had a new lift installed; last year, we used our funds to resurface the front playground and have new markings installed; just this year, we have had a new toileting and wet room facilities put in. Mr Hawkins is currently digging up part of the front playground for a new bike and scooter rack. However, all these things cost money.

We are lucky that, as a Catholic school, the Government grants us the status of being 'voluntary aided'. What this means is that although the schools are in the state system, we can retain our traditions and organise the school on the basis of the teachings of the Church and, indeed, most parents decide to send their children to a Catholic school because they know that their child will be educated in a Catholic environment and because they know that the school will provide an excellent education.

However, in returned for being 'voluntary aided', we are required by law to raise 10% of the cost of developing and maintaining the school buildings. I always try and find money and funding streams elsewhere in an effort to improve buildings. We were recently successful in a bid for over £210k to replace our leaky roof - the flat kitchen roof, and the roof that covers the building on the right-hand side as you face it, above the Year Three and Four classrooms. However, as part of the conditions, the school itself must pay 10% of the overall cost, likely to be £21,000. We have some funds set aside, but not the full amount.

I know the demands placed on you financially are great, and you are already so generous with your school fund and with

your charity fundraising. School Money has been set up to allow payments at a rate of £10 per term, per family.

However, if you are in a position to donate a greater amount to our School Building Fund, you can do so by bank transfer. The details are below:
