## **School Dinners Price Increase**

In view of increased costs, it was discussed and agreed at our latest Governor meeting that it is necessary to increase the cost of our daily meals to £2-70 per child. This increase applies to Key Stage Two only; Key Stage One and Reception continue to be funded by the government. The cost rise is regrettable but is unfortunately affected by the inflation of food and the cost transport, as well as paying the national insurance and Birmingham Living Wage of

our staff. It is also important to acknowledge two things: one is that the quality (and thus enjoyment) of our meals is extremely high, and the other is that school is still subsidising the cost considerably from our annual budget. We make no profit whatsoever from school meals.
