# **Attendance**

Our average attendance over the course of the year has been 96.2% which is above the national average.

The percentage of persistent absence (that is, with pupil's missing more than ten days) is 6.7% which is lower than nationally.

These statistics are shared with the Governors who often ask for the main contributing factors to absences. Other than illness, which accounts for 64.6% of our absence, they were alarmed to discover that holidays in term time account for 21.3% of our absence! This is why we never agree to them and why the local authority pursue and punish with fines parents who take their children on holiday during term time.

## Sporting achievements

Well done to all those children who have represented the school this year. We have taken part in a variety of sports and tournament this year, including girls' football, boys' football, tag rugby, cricket, athletics, Gaelic football, basketball, dodgeball and multi-sports. Thank you to the PTA who have funded a new trophy cabinet for us. We can start to fill it already!

My thanks especially to the PTA and parish who have helped to fund our minibus (which makes travel so much easier) and to Miss Ball who co-ordinates all the fixtures for any sporting events. She is truly remarkable!

#### **Data and results**

The results from the children's recent assessments have now been posted on the website, as is legally required each year. I have copied them below there for your convenience. Well done to all the children for their hard work and my thanks to all the staff.

Children are defined as having reached a Good Level of Development (GLD) at the end of the EYFS if they have achieved the expected level for the Early Learning Goals in the prime areas of learning: communication and language; personal, social and emotional development; physical development; and the specific areas of Mathematics and Literacy.
