THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 22nd September 2024

Homework

We have a very light touch approach to homework here at St Ambrose Barlow Catholic Primary School. Tasks are home focus solely on the recall of what has been taught in school, whereby children are asked to practise spelling rules and/or number bonds and times tables. With regards to Numbots or Times Table Rock Stars, by Monday each week, children are expected to have logged in for a certain amount of time across the week:

Year One: 15 minutes set using Activity Goal

Year Two: 20 minutes set using Activity Goal

Year Three and Four: 28 minutes which is an average time of 4 minutes per day

Year Five and Six: 35 minutes which is an average time of 5 minutes per day.
