St Teresa of Calcutta Multi-Academy Company

Some weeks ago, communication about this school potentially joining St Teresa of Calcutta Multi-Academy Company was sent out. This is in line with the Archbishop's vision for Catholic Education. Just to assure you, parents, of two queries I have fielded recently: the first is that part of the Archbishop's vision is that each CMAT (Catholic Multi-Academy Trust) is composed of around 20,000 pupils each. This means that the smaller MACs in existence will possibly merge with others to achieve these numbers. That said, it was the Diocese that directed us to which we should potentially join. The second is that parental choice for their choice of secondary schools is a right to be exercised and this is enshrined in what the church teaches – parents are the first educators of their children. Therefore, the school joining a particular academy trust will have no bearing on what secondary school a child can apply for. More on that below.

Secondary School options

Next Wednesday, senior leaders from all of our local secondary schools (St Peter's. Bishop Challoner. and Archbishop IIsley) are visiting to talk to our pupils about the importance of Catholic secondary education. They will speak to the children in class from around 2:30pm and then will remain on site after 3:30pm should any parents wish to attend and ask any questions. I urge you to take the time to speak to the headteachers for five or ten minutes. Parents have six choices when picking secondary school options: I urge you to use all six!
