Academisation

On Friday of last week, we formally submitted a request to the Department for Education to become an academy and join St Teresa of Calcutta Multi-Academy Company. A lot of the work will be completed in the background and it is envisaged the process will take around six to eight months. I would imagine the process will be completed at some point near the start of the next

academic year but I will endeavour to keep you updated.

As you may be aware, it is the vision of the Archbishop for every voluntary aided school to become an academy. Eventually, there will be four large Catholic Multi-Academy Trusts (CMATs) operating across the Archdiocese, each with approximately 20,000 pupils in its care. This means that, in time, every school will eventually apply to the DfE to do what we have done, and smaller MACs currently in operation will be merged into larger trusts. imagine, the very nature of the size of size of these CMATs will ensure that each school will retain its own individual identity. The application made to the DfE before half-term is literally to change the legal entity of the school and changes how we obtain our funding but, in the very short term, no changes to the day-to-day operation of the school (term dates, uniform, policies, and opening times) will be apparent.
