Congratulations, Year Three!



KiVa

The staff attended a meeting on Wednesday about how we can raise the profile of our KivA



curriculum approach. The idea is of KiVa simple: children are 'caught' being kind. The KiVa approach originated in Finland and, in Finnish, the word literally means 'nice. It is an anti-bullying programme that looks to dismantle the system that allows bullying to occur: a perpetrator who often requires an audience: the reinforcers: assenters who spectate; those that are aware of the situation but do nothing; and, finally, the victim who sometimes does not tell anyone how they are feeling. Each fortnight, children in KS2 will have a KiVa session and each month, we will celebrate those children who are 'caught being kind'.
